Hello students, families, and community! We hope you're doing well and staying healthy and safe. Also, a note about our Town Halls. Due to low attendance and limited topics, we have changed our Town Hall scheduled to every other week. We encourage you to register and join our BI-WEEKLY Town Halls. Elementary News: We are doing the Silverwood reading program again during the month of March. If students read for 10 hours and record it on their reading log they will earn a Silverwood ticket. All the reading must be done and turned in by March 31st.

Middle School News: What a great week it was as we started our 2-day a week hybrid learning. Starting February 8th, WMS transitioned from a one day a week model to a 2-day a week hybrid learning model. Both staff and students did a fantastic job maintaining a 6 ft distance, wearing masks appropriately over the mouth and nose, and washing/sanitizing hands throughout the day. Attendance is key to moving forward with student learning. Students are to either call the office (select #2 for the Attendance Line) or check in on-line for attendance each day they are not at school. Also key to moving forward is completing and returning homework. Please check with your child before their school day to make sure they have completed their work for all of their classes. With a 2-day a week hybrid model now underway, it is really important that students attend both days unless sick. On the opposite days students are learning from home, it is just as important for students to complete their homework and take notes on their Summit Focus Areas so they are ready for assessment approval. Please ask your child to show you his/her Summit Platform. If an item is "red," there is learning to be done, please feel free to call the school if you need any support understanding our platform.

High School News: Wellpinit High School has a new energy and excitement as we have moved to a 2 day a week in person hybrid model for your students. Your students have been respectful of others, are wearing their masks, and are following CDC guidelines. We have created a safe learning environment in our classrooms and in our hallways. With that in mind we are now charging ahead with academics and sports. Academics to prepare students for the future in Math, Science, Languages, Social Studies and other elective classes. Our classrooms are energized with students working one on one with instructors. If it weren't for the masks we would see all the smiles we know are there as they learn and interact with their fellow schoolmates.
